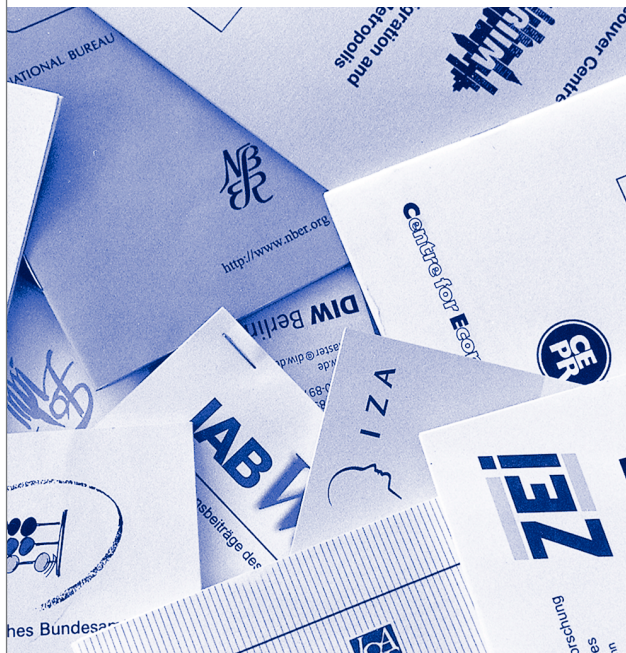

Cooperation with the University of Bonn

IZA carries out basic research in close cooperation with the Rheinische *Friedrich-Wilhelms-Universität Bonn* and its Faculty of Law and Economics. Funding by *Deutsche Post World Net* facilitated the foundation of the Bonn Graduate School of Economics (BGSE) in 1998, which continues the long-standing doctoral program at the University of Bonn. The Graduate School enables selected Ph.D. candidates to carry out intensive, focused studies, including several months of residence at a research institute abroad. IZA takes part in the selection and supervision of students and offers courses within the framework of the BGSE program. IZA Director Klaus F. Zimmermann is member of the board of directors of the Bonn Graduate School of Economics.

Since October 2000, the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG) has sponsored a new "*Graduiertenkolleg Quantitative Ökonomie*" (a graduate-level program in quantitative economics) jointly with the state of Northrhine-Westphalia. The *Graduiertenkolleg* operates as a subsection of the Bonn Graduate School of Economics.

IZA cooperates with the University of Bonn in the organization of joint events such as the *Bonn Economics Research Seminar*, with the participation of the economics branch of the Center for European Integration Studies (ZEI).

Authorized IZA staff may supervise diploma theses, dissertations, or postdoctoral lecturing qualifications (*Habilitationen*) of economics students at the University of Bonn. IZA's library with its specialization in labor economics is generally open to students of the University of Bonn as a reference library.

The successful cooperation between IZA and the University of Bonn is proof of a fruitful cooperation of public and privately sponsored research and education institutions.

IZA's Guest Researchers Program aims at encouraging scientific exchange between internationally renowned researchers and young economists. Guest researchers spend some time at IZA to discuss recent results of labor market research and to continue their own research projects. IZA in the Scientific Process

Awards

Numerous prizes and awards show that the high quality of IZA research receives growing appreciation in Germany and abroad. The IZA website has also received several awards for excellence in providing scientific information online. In the following, a selection of prizes and awards is presented.

John G. Diefenbaker Award 1998 to Klaus F. Zimmermann

In appreciation of his internationally acknowledged research activities, IZA Director Klaus F. Zimmermann received the John G. Diefenbaker Award of the Canada Council for the Arts, which is granted in cooperation with the Alexander-von-Humboldt Foundation. The Council stated that its decision was based on the high level of Zimmermann's research publications in labor economics and population economics. This is the first time that a German economist has been among the prizewinners. The award ceremony took place in Vancouver/Canada.

Munich Alumni Dissertation Prize to Thomas K. Bauer

With its annual "Alumni Dissertation Prize" the Volkswirte Alumni Club (VAC) Munich honors outstanding academic achievements of junior economists at the Economics Department of the University of Munich. Thomas K. Bauer received this prize in 1998 for his analysis on "Arbeitsmarkteffekte der Migration und der Einwanderungspolitik: Eine Analyse für die Bundesrepublik Deutschland" ("Labor Market Effects

of Migration and Immigration Policy: An Analysis for Germany").

Prize of the Association of the Friends of the DIW Berlin to Rainer Winkelmann

In July 2000, IZA Program Director Rainer Winkelmann received the "Prize of the Association of the Friends of the DIW for the Best Paper 1984-1998/99 Based on the German Socio-Economic Panel (Second Prize)". Parts of the award-winning study entitled "Why Are the Unemployed so Unhappy: Evidence from Panel Data", which was published in *Economica* in 1998, were cited in the IZA Compact newsletter in September 2000.

Nobel Prize in Economics to James Heckman

In October 2000, James J. Heckman (University of Chicago) and Daniel L. McFadden (University of California, Berkeley) received the Nobel Prize in Economics. James Heckman has been IZA Research Fellow since September 1998 and Associate Editor of the *Journal of Population Economics*, which is published by IZA. The Nobel Prize was awarded to Heckman for his development of theory and methods for analyzing selective samples. His approach is highly relevant to the work at IZA.

Sir Austin Robinson Memorial Prize to Rob Euwals

In August 2001, IZA Research Affiliate Wendelin Schnedler received the Young Economist Award of the European Economic Association (EEA) for his work on “Performance Pay and Job Characteristics” (IZA DP 235). In addition, Alois Stutzer and Rafael Lalive (both IZA Research Affiliates from the University of Zurich) received the award for their joint work on “The Role of Social Work Norms in Job Searching and Subjective Well-Being” (IZA DP 300).

IZA World Wide Web Presentation Nominated for the Web Business Award

In March 2001, IZA was nominated for the Web Business Award. Globalbizshows.com gives this award to companies and organizations for their efforts in raising awareness of the online community in the field of economics. Along with the World Bank, the World Economic Forum and other institutions, IZA was nominated because it “stood out from the rest of its field as having made major contributions online.”

IZA Website Among the “Best of the Best 2001”

In April 2001, the editors of the search engine vektor aktuell presented the IZA website with the “Best of the Best 2001” award. A team of competent online editors gives this award to German-language sites with premium-quality content.
